



Brush Pickup

Brush pickup is the first full week of the month, except for November and December, when leaf pickup has priority.

- *Brush should be placed near, but not beyond the curb.*
- *All limbs should be placed with the butt ends facing the same direction for ease of pickup. Branches may be no larger than 6 inches in diameter or 8 feet in length.*
- *Non-chippable brush will be picked up by pitchforks; **bag grass clippings and other loose non-brush plant material; better yet, consider starting a backyard compost pile.***
- *There is a 1 truck load limit per pickup day.*
- *Logs must be cut to a size that city employees can lift into a dump truck.*
- *Residents are required to keep all materials off sidewalks, parking areas and out of street ditches and gutters for safety.*



Leaf Pickup

The start/end of leaf vacuum pickup season is weather dependent, but normally begins at the end of Oct. and ends the first full week of Jan.

- *Leaves must be clear of brush, rocks, and anything that could damage the leaf vacuum.*
- *Keep leaf piles off streets, sidewalks and street drainage ditches and gutters.*
- *During the off-season (Jan – Oct), leaves, grass clippings and other loose plant material (like pine needles & mulch) must be bagged and weigh no more than 30 pounds.*

Chipped brush and shredded leaf mulch is stored at the Norris Public Works Building and is free to the public.

Household Hazardous Waste

Anderson County routinely conducts Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events. Dates Vary.

Items Accepted During the Event:

- Household Cleaners: Drain Openers, Polishes, Disinfectants, etc.
- Home Improvement / Maintenance: Oil-Based Paint, Adhesives, Strippers, Thinners, Removers, Wood Preservatives
- Home Lawn and Garden: Herbicides, Pesticides, Poisons, Fungicides
- Automotive Fluids: Oil & Fuel Additives, Starter Fluids, Solvents, Cleaners, Refrigerants, Coolants, Fuels
- Miscellaneous: Rechargeable Batteries, Photo Processing Chemicals, Pool Chemicals, Medicines/Drugs, Aerosols/ Compressed Gas, TV's, Computers and Related Equipment

Anderson County Residents may recycle the following at the Blockhouse Valley Center, located at 1480 Blockhouse Valley Road, Clinton (phone 463-6845).

- Dry Cell/Lead Acid Batteries
- Tires (with or without rims)
- Automotive Oil/Oil Filters
- Antifreeze
- Major Appliances
- Paint (latex and oil-based)
- Fluorescent Light Tubes.



Hours of operation: every Wednesday, 8 am to 4 pm; the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of each month , 8 am to 1 pm.

What to Recycle

Paper

- Magazines
- Paper Bags
- Junk Mail
- Newspapers/Inserts
- Phone Books
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Paper Board



Paper should be dry, remove plastic or foil food liners, flatten boxes

Plastic

(labeled 1 thru 7)

- Plastic Bags
- Food & Beverage Containers



Metal Cans *(rinsed)*

Aluminum & Steel



Glass Containers *(rinsed)*

Sorted Clear, Green, & Brown glass containers are recyclable. We strongly recommend sorting and recycling your glass at the Cedar Place Norris Recycle Center; glass recycled in curbside bins gets broken and cannot be sorted into separate colors. Unsorted/broken glass goes to land fill.



NOT ACCEPTABLE for Recycling

- Styrofoam of any kind
- Foam Trays (even if labeled 6 or 7)
- Lined Juice Boxes
- Waxed Cartons (Milk or Juice)
- Ceramics
- Broken Glass
- Window Glass (Regular or Tempered)
- Light Bulbs (of any kind)
- Pots & Pans
- Aluminum Foil Wrap (pans are OK)
- Soiled or Wet Paper
- Pizza Boxes

When to Recycle

Every Tuesday! Recycle and garbage trucks run on the same day. Service trucks are used to pick up both recyclables and garbage in areas with limited accessibility, such as service drives.



Important Note: *If you overflow your blue recycling bin, place the overflow into another container that is clearly labeled "Recycle." Self adhesive "Recycle" labels are available at the Norris City Office and at no charge to residents.*

Additional Recycling

Used Eyeglasses,

Place in drop boxes at the Library or City Office.

Used Motor Oil

Norris has a Used Motor Oil Recycling Facility located at the entrance to the Norris Public Works (Maintenance) Building. This large tank is locked at night to prevent vandalism. Hours of operation are Mon - Fri, 8 am - 4 pm.



Appliances & Electronics

Consider a local thrift store like Goodwill in Clinton (457-4798) or Habitat for Humanity for used but working appliances and electronic devices; if non-working, take them to Blockhouse Valley Recycle Center.



Corrugated Cardboard

Large quantities of cardboard boxes need not be put out at curbside. Recycle bins are located at the Norris Public Works Building.

Printer Cartridges

Drop off your empty printer cartridges at any ink refill retailer. Some office supply stores will take your empty cartridges as partial credit towards the purchase of new printer cartridges.
